Tomorrow, our Grade 5/6 students will take part in the District Ultimate Frisbee Tournament. We wish them a great day of teamwork, sportsmanship, and fun, while also raising awareness and support for spinal cord research.

If you haven't already, ask your child about Phyllis' Story, which explains how Orange Shirt Day began.

# **Inside vs Outside Days**

We try to be outside as much as possible before and after school and during recess and lunch play time. Appropriate outdoor clothing is important. Inside days are determined by the weather and air quality.

On rainy days please ensure your child is dressed to be warm, dry and comfortable when playing outside. Rain jacket, rainboots, and waterproof pants. It is also a good idea to send a change of clothing. On sunny days, especially fieldtrips, sunscreen, a hat, proper footwear and bug spray are strongly recommended. Students should be able to apply this themselves.
